

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
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## Paderewski Returns to New York

Ignacy Jan Paderewski (1860-1941) is one of the most extraordinary figures in Polish history. He was a world-famous pianist and composer, politician, diplomat, statesman, celebrity, friend of several American presidents, but above all a great Polish patriot. He was widely known as a philanthropist, a man with a big heart and mind. Ignacy Paderewski had a special influence on the history of his homeland, the history of music and the history of culture on a global scale. As Prime Minister of the Polish government and Minister of Foreign Affairs, in June 1919 he signed the Treaty of Versailles, the main peace treaty ending World War I, under which Poland regained independence.

Paderewski was one of the most famous musicians of the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries. Masterful piano playing, stage charisma, extraordinary personality and great erudition earned the artist the admiration and adoration of listeners around the world. Paderewski spent many years in America, and was particularly associated with New York. He arrived in New York in 1891 at the beginning of his artistic career in America and died in New York in 1941 in a room at the Buckingham Hotel. Ignacy Paderewski enjoyed extraordinary popularity, he was a superstar, an idol of the American public. Police had to close the streets in the areas where the artist was to appear. Crowds of admirers stormed the ticket offices. It was something that had never been seen in America before. Paderewski experienced the inconveniences of the life of a rock star some 50 years before the term "rock star" appeared, but Paderewski certainly did not play rock'n'roll.

## Paderewski Powraca do Nowego Jorku

Ignacy Jan Paderewski (1860-1941) jest jedną z najbardziej niezwykłych postaci w historii Polski. Był światowej sławy pianistą i kompozytorem, politykiem, dyplomatą, mężem stanu, celebrytą, przyjacielem kilku amerykańskich prezydentów, ale przede wszystkim wielkim polskim patriotą. Był powszechnie znany jako filantrop, człowiek o wielkim sercu i umyśle. Ignacy Paderewski miał szczególny wpływ na historię swojej ojczyzny, historię muzyki i historię kultury w skali globalnej. Jako premier rządu polskiego i minister spraw zagranicznych, w czerwcu 1919 r. podpisał traktat wersalski, główny traktat pokojowy kończący I wojnę światową na mocy, którego Polska odzyskała niepodległość.

Paderewski był jednym z najsłynniejszych muzyków przełomu XIX i XX wieku. Mistrzowska gra na fortepianie, charyzma sceniczna, niezwykła osobowość i wielka erudycja zapewniły artyście podziw i uwielbienie słuchaczy na całym świecie. Paderewski wiele lat spędził w Ameryce, szczególnie związany był z Nowym Jorkiem. Do Nowego Jorku przybył w 1891 roku na początek swojej kariery artystycznej w Ameryce i w Nowym Jorku zmarł w 1941 roku w pokoju hotelu Buckingham. Ignacy Paderewski cieszył się niezwykłą popularnością, był supergwiazdą, idolem amerykańskiej publiczności. Policja musiała zamykać ulice w rejonach, w których artysta miał się pojawić. Tłumy wielbicieli szтурmowały kasy biletowe. Było to coś, czego nigdy wcześniej nie widziano w Ameryce. Paderewski doświadczył niedogodności życia gwiazdy rocka jakieś 50 lat przed pojawieniem się terminu „gwiazda rocka”, ale Paderewski z pewnością nie grał rock'n'rolla.




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

# PADEREWSKI RETURNS TO NY FESTIVAL OPENING CONCERT

Ignacy Jan Paderewski (1860-1941) was an exceptional figure, a world-famous pianist, composer, statesman, philanthropist, celebrity, friend of six US presidents, idol of the American audience, but above all a great Polish patriot. As the Polish Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs, in June 1919 he signed the Treaty of Versailles, the main peace treaty ending World War I, which restored Poland's independence. Paderewski was an enthusiast of America, a country full of dynamism, accustomed to hard and honest work, opening up perspectives unknown to Europe at that time.

The artist made his debut at Carnegie Hall during his first tour of the United States in 1891 and until his death he participated significantly in the cultural life of New York. He made a valuable contribution to American culture, his talent gained universal recognition.
